• This sample roadmap does not include a language class. Before taking the general exam, you will need to satisfy the language requirement. Depending on your background, this might involve taking a language class.

• Keep in mind that many of the specific courses mentioned above are offered only once a year. Planning ahead and consulting with your advisor and/or GPC is the key to getting through the graduate program in a timely fashion.
