Romance Linguistics Major Ling 419: Senior Essay (3 credits) Grading Criteria

This essay concerns a linguistic problem of the student's choice, written under the supervision of a faculty consultant.

I. Goals of the Senior Essay

- Demonstrate knowledge of general properties of language
- Demonstrate integration, construction and application of this knowledge to linguistic analysis
- Demonstrate ability to identify discuss a linguistic problem

II. This paper should be approximately 10-15 pages and contain the following essential components and be graded according to the table below:

III. The following are essential components your paper should contain in order to achieve the goals stated above. In addition, attention must be paid to the form/organization of the paper. Numbers 1-3 pertain to the content and number 4 to the form of the Essay.

- 1. Possess a problem-centered focus
  - a. It's important to explain the underlying issues of the problem (i.e. simply defining or identifying the problem is not sufficient).
  - b. Presentation and discussion of data bearing on the research question (where relevant) is essential.
- 2. Employ critical thinking in problem solving
  - a. Salient arguments surrounding chosen issue should be identified including a thoughtful analysis and evaluation of major alternative points of view (which then allows for coherent conclusions).
  - b. Relevant literature must be included accompanied by an in-depth analysis of the information. This literature analysis should support the main points (i.e. including irrelevant literature or performing basic analysis is not sufficient)
  - c. The paper should integrate observations, inferences, and relationships to create meaning (i.e. simply observing and recording the most evident aspects of issue is not sufficient)
- 3. Justify conclusions
  - a. Conclusions should use previous information and concepts and draw plausible conclusions
- 4. Careful attention to form and organization of the paper
  - a. The paper content should enable the reader to follow the writer's argument through careful attention to organization.
  - b. The paper should reflect a careful editing process (references conform to the APA style guide, there are no typos, etc.)
