 - EDPSY 490 Basic Educational Statistics (3)
- Interdisciplinary research work, as approved by the advisor; examples:
 - Collaborative research work with a lab outside of the Linguistics department (can be at UW or another research institution)
 - Lab rotation/research credits outside of the Linguistics department
 - Presenting research at an interdisciplinary conference
